### The Precious Privilege We Have

The students of Fourth Baptist Christian School recently heard the testimonies of several Ukrainian pastors who came to speak at our elementary and secondary Pastor Nicholai Velichko chapels. pastors the largest independent Baptist church in the Ukraine. This church is the same church that the well-known preacher, Georgi Vins, attended in the city of Kiev. Besides serving at his church. Pastor Velichko serves President of the Brotherhood of Independent **Baptist** Churches Ukraine. missionary-minded association of 140 churches striving to win souls for Christ across their country.

More than 100 churches have been planted since the fall of the Soviet Union. The other pastor we heard from was Pastor Eugene Buyko, Baptist International Evangelical Ministries (BIEM) missionary director in the Ukraine. Both men shared the story of persecution in the former Soviet Republic.

Pastor Velichko went to jail for three years for doing what the government, at that time would not allow, teaching the Word of God. It was the Soviet government's objective that no one, especially children, could learn about God. The government taught that there was no God. The government was determined to make it so that the younger generation grew up entirely without God.

Pastor Buyko told us of when he was a boy: "We used to have church in houses. As teens, we would go and have church in the woods. Our youth groups always met under the open skies. When the preacher would stay at our home, we would ask to borrow his Bible and we would stay up all night and write, by hand, as many of the verses from his Bible as we could. We didn't have Bibles


of our own and we wrote those verses down to try to memorize them because we understood how precious the Word of God was." Pastor Buyko shared another story of his childhood in the mid-1980's. His mother was teaching the children the Bible after school and the police showed up at their home. About fifteen children were playing outside and the police planned to take the children away. began to load them in their bus when pastor's the mom demanded that they give back her children. The police told her that she could board the bus and take her children off. So, she stormed into the bus and told all fifteen children to get into the house. When the police asked if they were all her children, she replied that all fifteen children were her The children quickly children. scattered to safety and escaped going to jail.



The Ukraine is now free. Churches are operating free from government intrusion and there are even Christian schools operating in the country. Both

men stated that people hungered after God's Word under government oppression. Now, the economy has finally started to improve and people are starting to become complacent about the things of God.

After the men left, I must admit that I was quite troubled. I take so much for granted. We have been given so much, and the freedoms we have enjoyed in our country are tremendous. I read today that the Blunt Amendment was voted down in the Senate. There are numerous court challenges to the current legislation. Obamacare This legislation has been described as the largest abortion funding bill in history. The direction our liberal government is taking us is far away from God. We continue to attempt to get clarification regarding the stipulations in the Early Learning Challenge Grant that the state of Minnesota recently won. We continue to fight to secure legislation to protect our Christian schools. I don't know if there was ever a time in our history when our Christian schools were needed more. Could it be that God is allowing us to go through a time of uncertainty? Could it be that we may have to lose the religious rights we have enjoyed to draw us back to God as a people? The Republic of Ukraine fought for its religious freedom and won those freedoms when the Soviet Union fell. But even a place that knew religious persecution as recent as 25 years ago seems to have forgotten the blessings of the religious freedoms she now enjoys.



What about the United States? What about the people of our communities? What about you and me? We must come to the place where we realize the great privilege we have to be able to worship freely in our churches and for our children to attend our Christian school. May we not forget. May we not take any of this for granted. May we fall on our knees in gratefulness to God for what He has allowed us to have - churches that teach God's Word and Christian schools that act as an extension of the Christian home, schools with Bible-believing teachers who

mentor our children, schools that pray for and with our children and equip them to think from a distinctly Christ-centered world view. We are so blessed.

As both Ukrainian pastors spoke, they spoke simplistically. They communicated genuine gratefulness for what God was doing in their nation reminded us of the privilege we have enjoyed. So what was the Lord teaching me today? believe He was teaching me that I cannot grow weary in the fight. We cannot become apathetic regarding current issues, the upcoming election, or in our faithful service to God's work. While seems that it our government desires that our children grow up without God, we must renew our commitment to stand firm for the teaching of the Word of God in our churches and schools. The battle is great, but the battle is worth it. Much

is at stake. We cannot turn a deaf ear to what we are hearing and we cannot be blind to what we are seeing. We cannot be so apathetic that we stand idly by and watch our freedoms slip away.

Why did so many members of the House of Representatives want to speak to our contingency of administrators and pastors back in September at our American Association of Christian Schools Legislative Conference? What they told us I cannot forget: "The next election will determine the direction of our nation for many years to come. Will we continue to move in a godless direction? Or will we regain some of the ground we have lost to maintain and guarantee our religious freedoms?"

The pastors from the Ukraine reminded me of how far they had come and where the United




States could go.
