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SAT Achievement Test Results Are Going Home to Parents – What Do They Really Mean?

AACS (American Association of Christian Schools) is currently utilizing the Stanford Achievement Testing (SAT) system for one more year. This is the testing system that our schools use in April of each year. Most of our MACS schools send home the results with the final report card. For as long as I can remember, our schools have had the privilege of testing with SAT, but due to the



new common core standards enacted throughout most of the nation's state education departments, SAT will not be rewriting their tests to reflect those changes. AACS is currently studying what they will do for their annual achievement testing in the coming years as the SAT 10 test will no longer be available to us. We will keep you posted in the coming months as we learn more about alternative testing programs that will best serve the needs of our Christian schools and students.

In the meantime, parents will be receiving the SAT test results for their children. A quick overview of what the test communicates to them about their child's

academic performance might be helpful. As you look at the results sheet, please follow from the top left to the right as I attempt to explain the SAT results.

The student's name and teacher appears on the top with the testing date and a short paragraph (on the left side) about the child's overall performance. The child's performance is summarized in a **percentile band**. Let's say that the child scored in the 70th percentile, this would mean that this child performed as well or better than 70% of the students nationally who took the test in 2014.


Below that is the **Lexile Measure** Scoring which reports a reading comprehension score (at FBCS, we choose to pay extra for this measurement). This score can be used to help improve a child's reading comprehension by

stretching the level of difficulty of books students will read over the summer. See www.lexile.com for more information.

To the right, **subtests** are listed with results in the right columns. Those subtests start out with Total Reading, Word Study Skills, Reading Vocabulary, etc. The total number of correct answers are given out of the total possible in each category.

The "Scaled Score" is a score used to compare the child's score from year to year. For our purposes, the other scores are currently more valuable to know.

The "National PR-S" is a percentage rank score that ranks students with other students nationally. This score would include any public, charter, or private school students who took this test in 2014. It would be comparing our



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students with a very large population of students. The "S" is a standard score which represent the nationwide group by dividing it into nine groups: one being the lowest and nine being the highest. The next column "AACS PR-S" compares our students with only AACS schools nationally.

The "Grade Equivalent Score" is a tricky and often misunderstood score. If a child scores a 10.7 on the Reading Vocabulary section and is currently a fifth grader, this does not necessarily mean that a child could read at the tenth grade level. What it does mean is that a tenth grader taking the same reading vocabulary test would have the same score as this fifth grade child. This is good news because it means that the child, in this category, is doing very, very well.

The AAC Range is labeled as Low, Middle, or High and is *only listed* when the child takes the Otis-Lennon Test, a test which measures the IQ (intelligence quotient) of the child. (FBCS gives the Otis-Lennon (OLSAT) test to students in the 2nd, 4th, 6th, 8th, and 10th grade years of school.) For example, if a child's SAI (School Ability Index) is at 100, the child is testing at the average level for their grade and age level.

The following SAI scores and percentages show where students taking the OLSAT fall nationally:

An **SAI** measuring:

Above 132 – about 2% of the population 116—132 – about 14% of the population 84—116 – about 68% of the population 68—84 – about 14% of the population Below 68 – about 2% of the population

The AAC of Low, Middle, or High corresponds directly with the SAI score. If the child's SAI was a 115, and the AAC Range was "High" for the Reading Vocabulary section, then that child was performing above the expected range of their IQ or SAI score. If "Middle" appears, then the child is testing where they should be in accordance with their SAI or IQ score. If "Low" appears, the child is not testing up to the expected level per their SAI.

The chart on the right entitled **National Grade Percentile Bands** is a visual representation of the National PR-S column.

The section below entitled, **Clusters**, breaks the test down and the results can be used to identify areas that need extra attention should the student test in the below average range. Schools can purchase a <u>Compendium of Instructional Standards</u> from Pearson Publishing Company which identifies the questions on the SAT test assigned to that specific topic area. Schools can see the questions the student missed by comparing the compendium with the actual SAT questions in the test booklet. This information can be used to help students who are deficient in a specific area where test performance was below grade level.


